Title: Management of Naso-orbital Fistula following Maxillectomy: A Case Report

Asbstract:

Naso-orbital fistulas can occur following surgeries of theorbit and adjacent structures (paranasal sinuses) for ma-lignant tumours. Aggressive local therapy of the malignan-cies of nose and paranasal sinuses is essential as they lieadjacent to the vital structures like orbit and the cranialcavity. Fistulas generally occur when bony orbital and nasalwalls are resected or penetrated to achieve local tumourclearance. Various methods have been described to managepost-operative naso/sino-orbital fistulas including primaryclosure, split skin or full thickness grafts, local, distant andfree flaps. We describe a case of naso-orbital fistula follow-ing extended maxillectomy and radiotherapy for maxillarysinus malignancy which was treated with scalp advance-ment flap
